

The strategy highlights the importance of a regional, multi-sectoral approach, which engages

Government entities, faith-based organizations, civil society, and communities and aims to foster

collaboration across various sectors to prevent violence through innovative and comprehensive

solutions.

Key outcomes of the strategy include strengthening communities through support for parenting,

developing curricula that promote social cohesion, building resilient societies and prevention.

Minister Browne acknowledged the work of the United Nations and spoke highly of the quality of

the UN programmes that have been implemented in Trinidad and Tobago. He emphasised the

commitment of the Government of Trinidad and Tobago to broaden collaboration with the United

Nations agencies. The Minister and the UN Resident Coordinator discussed potential next steps

of crime and violence affecting Trinidad and Tobago and the CARICOM region.
