TEMPORARY BORDER MEASURES UNDERTAKEN BY CANADA IN RESPONSE TO THE CURRENT OUTBREAK OF EBOLA

PORT OF SPAIN: 3RD JUNE, 2026

Nationals of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago, who are dual nationals of Canada or Permanent Residents, are advised that Canada has instituted temporary border measures in response to the current outbreak of Ebola. In this regard, the Ministry of Foreign and CARICOM Affairs has been advised that the Government of Canada has suspended immigration documents for residents of countries that have a high or very high risk of outbreak of Ebola disease for 90 days beginning, 27 May, 2026 at 23:59 (Eastern Daylight Time/EDT).

At this time, this includes three countries: **the Democratic Republic of the Congo, the Republic of Uganda, and the Republic of South Sudan**. While the risk to people in Canada remains low, the Government of Canada is taking a precautionary approach given the severity of Ebola disease and the evolving international situation, including the FIFA World Cup 2026 TM.

Canada also implemented an additional measure effective 30 May, 2026 at 23:59 EDT until 29 August, 2026, whereby Canadian citizens, permanent residents, persons registered under the Indian Act, and foreign nationals, who have been in these areas within the previous 21 days and do not have symptoms, will have to quarantine for 21 days upon arrival in Canada.

Those who are already in Canada are not impacted by these measures.
