GUIDELINES AND CONDITIONS FOR ISSUANCE OF AN EMERGENCY CERTIFICATE

An Emergency Certificate (E.C.) is a document issued to Trinidad and Tobago citizens for the purpose of URGENT, DIRECT, ONE-WAY travel to Trinidad and Tobago. Emergency Certificates, are ONLY issued to persons who already possess a Trinidad and Tobago Machine Readable passport (MRP). Attaché assigned to the Embassy. Before submitting an application for an Emergency Certificate, persons should contact the Embassy's Immigration Department at 202-467-6490 or embdcimmigration@foreign.gov.tt for required information.

The Emergency Certificate (travel document) is valid <u>only</u> for <u>direct</u>, <u>one-way</u> travel to Trinidad and Tobago based on the date stated on itinerary.

- If the intended travel is rescheduled later than seven days from original travel date, the bearer must immediately notify the issuing office.
- If travel arrangements are cancelled this document must be returned to the issuing office.

CHECKLIST FOR EMERGENCY CERTIFICATE:

- o Completed application form.
- o Trinidad and Tobago Machine Readable passport.
- o Computer Generated Birth or Adoption Certificate.
- Document(s) showing proof of emergency.
- o Coloured copy of relevant *valid* identification.
- o Marriage Certificate(s) and Divorce Decree(s), applicable to women.
- Name Change document or Deed Poll
- o Two (2) Passport photos 2" x 2", white background.
- Proposed Travel Itinerary.

Signature

Additional documents may be required on a case-by-case basis.

- POSTAGE: a money order for \$28.75 (subject to change) must be provided for postage, along with a letter of authorization to have documents mailed.
 - The authorization letter must include <u>full name</u> (addressee), <u>full address</u> of where the package should be mailed and a valid <u>contact number</u>. The authorization letter can also be found on our website at <u>www.foreign.gov.tt/embwashington</u> (Document 13).

Date

The Emergency Certificate must be surrendered to the Immigration Officer at the port of entry in Trinidad and Tobago. An Emergency Certificate is **NOT A PASSPORT**. A passport **must** be obtained for future travel.

The issuance of an Emergency Cei	rtificate does not permit the bearer to an expedited passport process in
