

# GUIDELINES AND CONDITIONS FOR ISSUANCE OF AN EMERGENCY CERTIFICATE

An Emergency Certificate (E.C) is a document issued to a Trinidad and Tobago citizen for the purpose of **URGENT ONE WAY** travel to Trinidad and Tobago.

The **Certificate is valid for seven (7-10) days from the date of issue**. If the intended travel is rescheduled later than ten days from original date of travel, the bearer must notify the issuing office. If travel is cancelled this document must be returned to the issuing office.

This document must not be tampered with in any manner.

The person applying for the E.C must provide the following.

- Completed application form
- Current Trinidad and Tobago passport
- Computer generated Birth Certificate; Marriage Certificate other relevant documents
- 2 Passport photos, white background
- Document/s showing proof of Emergency
- Flight Itinerary

The Emergency Certificate must be surrendered to the Immigration Officer at the port of entry in Trinidad and Tobago. An Emergency Certificate is **NOT A PASSPORT**. (A passport must be obtained for future travel).

The issuance of an Emergency Certificate **does not** entitle the bearer to an expedited passport process in Trinidad and Tobago.
