



**NOTICE OF VACANCY**  
**APPOINTMENT TO THE OFFICE OF PUISNE JUDGE**  
**OF THE HIGH COURT OF JUSTICE OF TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO**

The Judicial and Legal Service Commission proposes shortly to advise the President of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago to fill vacancies in the complement of Puisne Judges of the High Court of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Trinidad and Tobago pursuant to subsection (1) of Section 104 of the Constitution of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago.

The Commission invites applications for this office from suitably qualified Nationals and Commonwealth citizens, who have been admitted to practice as an Attorney-at-Law in Trinidad and Tobago, or called to the Bar of England or any Commonwealth country, and are of not less than 10 years standing. Judges maybe required to preside in both the Civil and Criminal jurisdiction of the High Court.

In addition to the minimum qualification set out above, applicants with extensive experience in either Civil (constitutional, administrative and commercial law) or Criminal Law would be an asset.

Applicants should fulfil the criteria by which the Commission is guided in making such appointments; viz. professional competence, integrity, temperament and experience.

All applications must be accompanied by a full resume of the applicant who must be available for interview by the Commission, if required.

The Commission does not bind itself to make an appointment from among those persons who apply.
